CAMPUS FEATURES

This 22-acre campus includes five buildings, all of which are owned and operated by the federal government as part of the National Archives and Records Administration.

MUSEUM

The museum is divided into nine galleries that cover Ike and Mamie's life, as well as a rotating exhibit gallery.

LIBRARY

As part of the National Archives and Records Administration, the Library provides access to researchers in the archives. The building is open to the public and often has small exhibits.

PLACE OF MEDITATION

Quietly reflect at the final resting place of Dwight and Mamie, along with their first son, Doud Dwight Eisenhower.

VISITORS CENTER

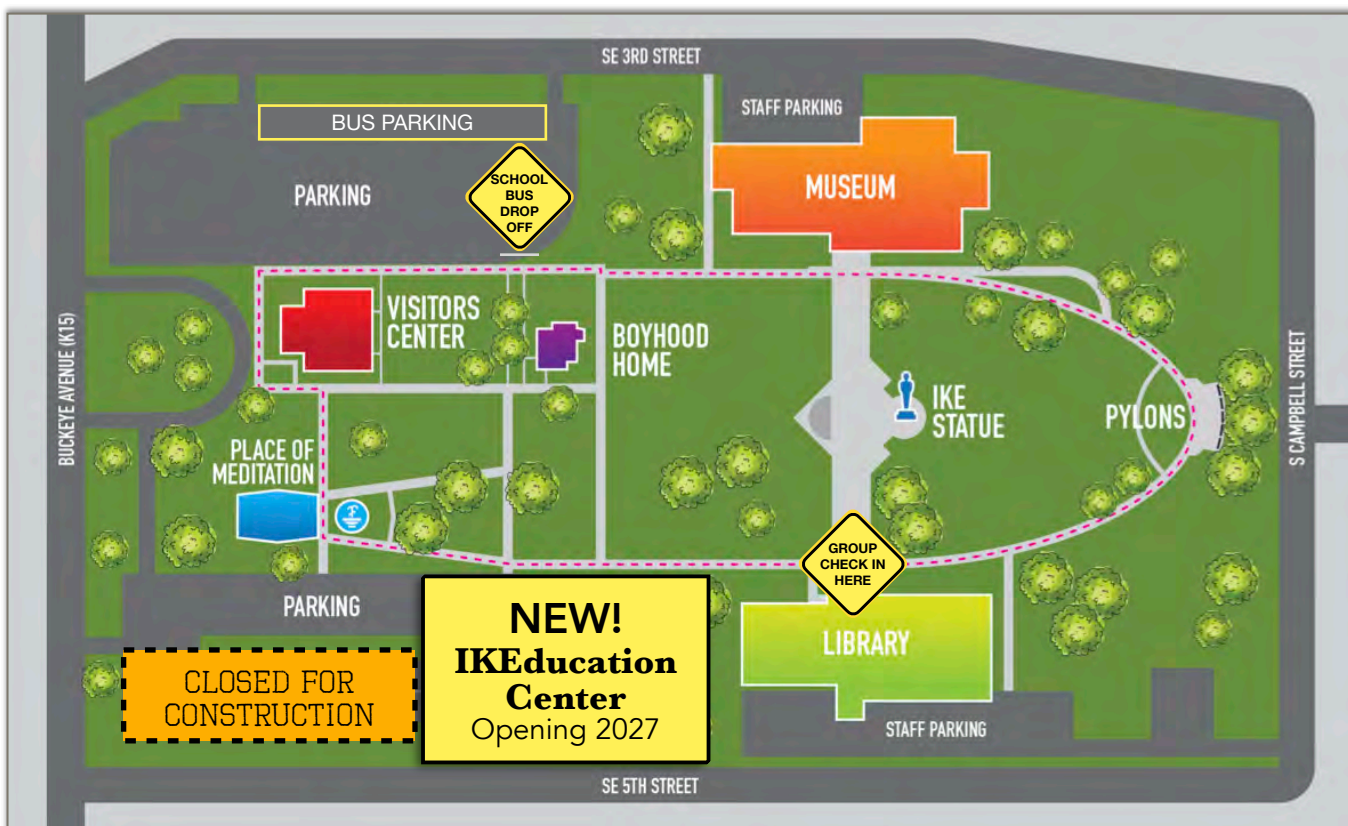
Visit the gift shop and watch a film that provides an overview of Ike's amazing life.

IKE STATUE AND PYLONS

The bronze statue of General Eisenhower in the center of campus and the pylons on the east end of campus are great spots for class photos.

TO BOOK AN ONSITE FIELD TRIP

1

RESERVING YOUR FIELD TRIP

To begin the process of booking an IKE Onsite field trip, simply fill out a Field Trip Request Form ("Book Now") at IKEducation.com.



Please note, dates are limited and available on a first-come basis. Reservations must be made **at least three weeks in advance**. There is a **10 student minimum** requirement.

CUSTOM FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE

Using the information submitted on your Field Trip Request Form, an IKEducator will work with you to create a custom field trip schedule.

COMPLETE THE LEAD TEACHER CONTRACT

A contract **must** be completed and returned by the lead teacher who will be with the group on their field trip.

4

ADULT SUPERVISION

When arranging adult chaperones, schools are **required to provide at least one supervisory adult for every 10 students**. To support active supervision, we offer **free admission for up to one adult chaperone for every five students**.

Because space is limited, we ask that groups, please do not bring additional adults or adults accompanied by younger children, as this can create space limitations and distractions during student programming.

Chaperone Agreement and Roll Call Sheets

To ensure a positive and safe experience, each chaperone must complete and sign an agreement form and be supplied with Roll Call Sheets. These are due before the field trip can begin.

WHAT'S BEHIND THE MARBLE? Grades 6-12 30 minutes

As part of the National Archives, the Eisenhower Presidential Library preserves and protects our American history. An archivist will introduce students to what is found behind the library's marble walls.



B

VIDEO: IKE OVERVIEW Grades 5-12 30 minutes

This video provides an overview of Dwight D. Eisenhower's life. It is shown in the Visitors Center, which is located on the site of the former Lincoln Elementary School where "Little Ike" attended grade school.

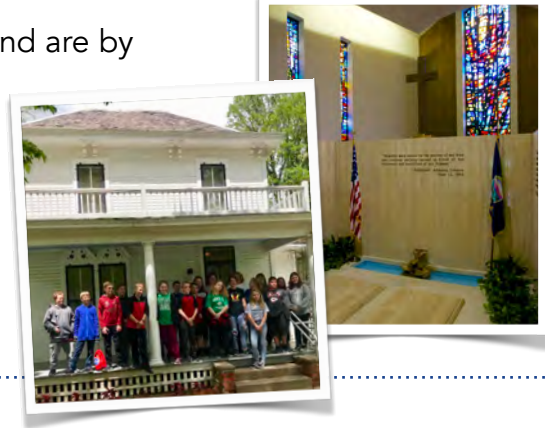


C

BOYHOOD HOME AND BURIAL SITE Grades K-12 30 minutes

Tours inside the home have a limited availability and are by reservation only. Here, students get a glimpse at life for “Little Ike” and his family in the early years of the twentieth century.

Called the “Place of Meditation,” students will visit the final resting place of Ike, Mamie, and their first son, Doud.



D

CIVICS IQ Grades 5-12 30 minutes

Students will learn about — and try their hands at — the test that applicants for U.S. citizenship must pass as part of the naturalization process.



E

MARINE ONE Grades K-4 30 minutes

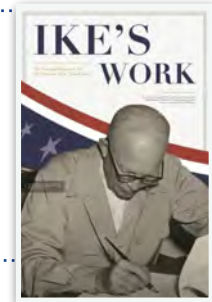
Did you know Ike was the first U.S. President to travel by helicopter? This transformed presidential travel by allowing the president to land and depart directly from the White House grounds. Students will get hands-on with the basic aerodynamics that cause rotary blades to lift helicopters.



F

IKE'S WORK Grades 7-12 30 minutes

Centered around Eisenhower's own list of top administration accomplishments, this temporary museum exhibit showcases relevant letters written to the President by American citizens.



G

WE THE PEOPLE Grades K-12 30 minutes

The American flag is made of many individual stars, stripes, and colors that together represent one united nation. In this IKEtivity, each student will create one unique "piece" of the flag, demonstrating how individual contributions can come together to create something far greater than any one person could accomplish alone. Students' finished pieces will be used in an art installation in our upcoming Education Center!

SPACE RACE

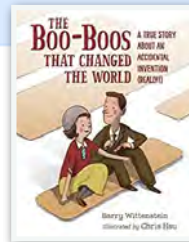

Students join the Eisenhower Museum Forensic Investigation Unit as they investigate the disappearance of *Project Blue Book* from a museum exhibit. Through fingerprint collection and analysis, students apply real forensic science techniques, critical thinking, and evidence-based reasoning to solve the mystery.

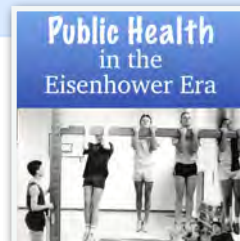

When America's men left to fight with the Allies in World War II, women were recruited to work at non-traditional jobs in defense plants and factories. These "Rosie the Riveters" proved their abilities and have not looked back since. Students sing, recreate their own Rosie photo, and analyze primary source photos and posters.



VICTORY GARDENS

Grades 3-8 50 minutes



During World War II, Americans planted 20 million Victory Gardens to help provide food for troops and families at home. Students explore primary sources to learn how these gardens supported the war effort and brought communities together. Then, they connect the past to today by planning their own garden for a greener future!

Ike loved golf so much he had a putting green installed at the White House in 1954—and even left spike marks on the Oval Office floor! In this activity, students will practice their putting skills and use geometry to design their own mini-golf holes.



CAST AWAY



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Grades 3-8 50 minutes

Throughout his life, Ike loved to fish. As a boy in Abilene, Kansas, he could walk to nearby fishing holes with a willow shoot, a length of string, a 5-cent hook from the general store, and worms that he collected from the family garden to fish for a meal or two. As an adult and world hero, Ike was able to use more sophisticated gear and became a fixture on the covers of fishing magazines. Students will make their own DIY casting gear and try their hand at basic casting skills.



PAINT LIKE IKE



ART

Grades K-12 80minutes

Shortly before D-Day, Ike outlined and organized a military unit, commonly known as the Monuments Men, who were tasked with minimizing the damage to art and save it from Hitler.

Not long after World War II, Ike took up the hobby of painting and enjoyed it throughout the rest of his life. Students will view several of Ike's works and have a chance to "paint like Ike" by completing one of his landscapes.
